Agnes Pauline "Polly" Singleton, 89, passed away quietly Saturday, August 25, 2012. She was born October 16, 1922, to Willie and Dona Brown in Drury, MO. She was raised near Ava, MO and was the second oldest of six children. She quit school early on to help raise her brothers and sisters, along with her paternal grandparents, after her mother's death.
