



## Billy E. Singleton

January 29, 1944 - November 18, 2014

Billy Eugene "Bill" Singleton, 70, passed away Tuesday, November 18, 2014, from pulmonary fibrosis and pneumonia. Bill was born in Wichita, KS on January 29, 1944, to Max Singleton and Pauline (Brown) Singleton and graduated from high school in East Wenatchee. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Business from Central Washington University, before joining the Army in 1967. He served in Vietnam from 1968 to 1969 (Co. C, 6th, 31st), where he received two Purple Hearts and the Bronze Star. In 1969, he married Margery Rosenquist in Longview, WA and later they had one daughter, Anne. While living in Wenatchee, he worked for the Entiat Ranger District and then later the Chelan County P.U.D. After retiring from the P.U.D. as a hydro mechanic foreman, he joined the East Wenatchee VFW, serving as Commander for a year and most recently coordinating drivers for the post's medical van. He also volunteered for several years as a driver for Mobile Meals. A lifelong interest in the Civil War led him to join the Washington Civil War Association, where he was thrilled to be able to fire off the cannon to the delight of visitors.

He is survived by his wife, Margery of East Wenatchee; daughter, Anne of Sammamish, WA; father, Max of East Wenatchee; and brothers Ron, of East Wenatchee, and Richard of Dennis, MA.
