He started out sweeping the floors and was quickly moved into the purchasing department ,where he retired on March 31, 2015 as the Purchasing Manager. He always told the young kids, "there is value in starting at the bottom and working to better your position." His position in purchasing gave him the opportunity to meet and develop many close life-long friendships with vendors in three states. He loved his job and enjoyed going to work to be with 50 great and wonderful friends everyday.

Bobby was a former member of the Purchasing Management Association of Washington, serving as a board member. He belonged and was very active in the Central Washington Bass Club.
