



## Boyce D. Insell

August 2, 1920 - March 11, 2009

Boyce D. Insell passed away on Wednesday, March 11, 2009, in Cashmere, WA. He was born on August 2, 1920, to Frank M. and R. Ellen Insell at Wiseman, AR, where he was raised and attended school. Boyce moved to Wenatchee in February of 1939, at the age of 18. He married Juanita R. Wallace on July 5, 1941, at East Wenatchee, WA. They had been together almost 68 years. He enlisted in the Army Air Force on August 3, 1942. After serving three and a half years, he received an honorable discharge on December 12, 1945, at Andrews Field, MD. After discharge, he worked in orchards, construction, warehouses, Hanna Mining and along with his wife, Juanita, owned the Village Queen Drive-In on Grant Road. He also worked in Real Estate as a salesman and Broker. He retired in 1986, and traveled with his wife in their motor home and spent winters in Southern California. He was a member of Eastmont Baptist Church, Past Master of William H. Jett Lodge 285 F.A.A.M., Past Patron of Astral Chapter #75 Order of Eastern Star and worked many hours with youth and sports organizations. He enjoyed fishing, golf and spending time with friends and family.

Boyce is survived by his wife, Juanita Insell of East Wenatchee; daughter, Regina Sue Batchelor and husband, Larry of Wenatchee; son, Frank E.
