Charles "Charlie" Paine, beloved husband, father, Poppa and friend, passed away peacefully after a long, hard fought battle with cancer, early February 14, surrounded by his loving family.

Charlie was born in Ree Heights, South Dakota on July 28, 1936 to Kermit and Fyrn Paine. The following year his family moved to Wenatchee. He grew up and graduated from Wenatchee High School in 1954. After graduating he enlisted and proudly served in the U.S. Marine Corps. After basic training, he was stationed at the Edenton Air Base in North Carolina as an airplane mechanic.

During the early years of their marriage, they lived in several places and ultimately decided to make Wenatchee their home.
