George Edward Shivel, known as "Ed," was born in Portland, TN, July 27 1927, to Lester and Cathrine Shivel. The Shivel family had settled in the Bitterroot Valley in Montana in the 1800's, and Ed's family followed them shortly after his birth. He attended school in Grantsdale and graduated from Hamilton High. He joined the Army in 1945, was sent to France and Germany from 1946 to 1948 at the end of WWII, where he received the Victory and Army Occupancy Medals. He was called back for the Korean War from 1950 to 1951, where he received a Bronze Star and suffered with Malaria. Ed returned home to the Bitterroot Valley, as his immediate family had moved to Seattle to find work. Ed married, moved to Seattle and raised a family. He worked for the U.S. Postal Service as a Mail Carrier for 32 years, divorced, retired to Boise, ID and then moved back to Hamilton, MT for many years. Lastly, Ed moved to the Wenatchee Valley in Washington, to be closer to his children and grandchildren. He died in Wenatchee on July 25, 2011, after many medical complications. Ed was an avid gun enthusiast, hunter and horseman and he enjoyed the great outdoors, fishing and camping.

Ed is survived by his children, James M. of Wenatchee, WA, Susan A.

Anderson of Federal Way, WA, Mark E. and his wife, Rhonda of Kent, WA and Monte L. of Boise, ID; his siblings, Elizabeth of Tacoma, WA, Mary of Hamilton, MT and Perry (unknown).
