Gerald John Vreeman was born January 5, 1929, to John Vreeman and Julia (Hollander) Vreeman on the family farm near Sioux Center, IA. He attended country school through the eighth grade and completed his education at Sioux Center Community High School. Gerald served his country for three years as a member of the US Army. While in the service, he was recruited by the intelligence division and served as a courier for the Central Intelligence Agency in Germany. On December 27, 1951, while on leave from the service, he married Evelyn Hooyer at the Sioux Center Christian Reformed Church. In 1964, Gerald moved from Iowa to Quincy, WA. In 1995, he moved to Wenatchee, WA, where he resided until his death on December 6, 2015. He was a member of the Christian Reformed Church where he was baptized, professed his faith, and worshipped all of his life.
