Howard was awarded a Bronze Service Arrowhead, a Victory Medal, an Atlantic Pacific Service Medal, a Good Conduct Medal, and a Phillipine Liberation Medal with Two Bronze Stars. According to Howard Hill, he won the war by himself!

He went on to live in Kent, WA. He was a Superintendent for Moss Construction, INC for 50 years and a member of Operating Engineers 302 for 70 years. His love of life included his family, carving, and fishing. His favorite past-time was spending time spent at Longacres and Emerald Downs Racetracks.
