Jetta Mae Lawrence, 85, of East Wenatchee, WA, passed away on May 2, 2011. She was born on April 5, 1926, in Oil Trough, AR to Robert Arthur and Mary Ethel Pearce. Because of the inactivity, she developed a blood clot and was not able to recover.
