



## Larry Ray Shutt

July 15, 1943 - January 19, 2022

Larry Ray Shutt, age 78, passed away January 19, 2022 of heart failure in East Wenatchee, Washington.

Larry was born July 15, 1943 in Tacoma, Washington to Claude and Frances Shutt. His twin brother, John, was his constant companion. Larry was one of 5 children.

He graduated from Franklin Pierce HS in 1962. Larry met Kathleen Halliday that same year. In 1964 Larry served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. In 1966, he enlisted in the US Army with a MOS of Avionics Electronics. Larry and Kathleen were married in August, 1966.

In January, 1967 Larry was sent to Germany. He worked at the heliport in Heilbronn, Germany.

In February, 1969, after his release, they settled in Graham, Washington. They have 6 children. As Pacific NW Fence, he served the people of greater Tacoma for 18 years.

In 1988, the family moved to Chelan, Washington. Larry was known as Bright Horizons, serving the people of Chelan and surrounding communities for 18

years.

Larry was a man of integrity and action, whether in business or for the family. During his lifetime, he and Kathleen built 6 homes, five of which the family lived in. He was a classic car buff. He bought and restored an estimated 20 classic cars. His love of family, country and the gospel of Jesus Christ were his hallmark. He knew how to serve others.

He is survived by his wife, Kathleen of East Wenatchee; three daughters Barbra, Lisa, and Leah; three sons Darren, Kevin and Kyle; brothers Sidney and Donald, and sister Sarah; and 26 grandchildren. He will be sorely missed.
