Lawrence Douglas "Doug" Hake, 85, of Wenatchee, passed away peacefully on August 5, 2016 at home. While a young boy, the family moved to Cashmere and later to Wenatchee, where he attended school, graduating from Wenatchee High School in 1950. He met Lola J. Doug and Lola celebrated 47 years of marriage before her death in 2004. With 30 years of service, he retired from the City of Wenatchee Department of Public Works in 1985. With a ready smile and a servant's heart, he was always willing to assist others and readily lend them a hand. In his younger years he enjoyed singing tenor with the Apollo Club Men's Chorus, camping, and was a dedicated 4-H leader.
