Lloyd passed away on December 6, 2015, after a brief battle with cancer. He was 93 years old. Lloyd was born in Oxford, AR. There, he was raised and worked with his father in the farming business through the Depression and Dust

Bowl, after which he joined the CC's (Conservation Corps) at the age of 16. At age 18, he returned to Arkansas, where he married his first and only love of his life, Florence Lee Davis, on February 14, 1942. They moved together to Wenatchee in 1942, where he worked in the fruit industry. Shortly thereafter, their first son, Bob R. Davis, was born in 1943. Later, he was drafted into the U.S. Coast Guard, where he served on a fuel tanker refueling war ships in the South Pacific. He was very proud of his service to the country. He was discharged on February 5, 1946. The family returned to Wenatchee and Lloyd went to work at Grandstaff's Market on Wenatchee Avenue. Later on, he became

the proprietor of a Shell Service Station, at the foot of 9th Street, in East Wenatchee. Lloyd ran this station for several years. In February 11, 1947, their second son, Larry W. Davis, was born. Lloyd went to work for Wenatchee Truck and Tractor as a mechanic until 1957, when he went out on his own and

started Lloyd's Auto and Truck. Following his retirement in 1986, his sons ran the family business, until they sold it in 2001.

Lloyd was preceded in death by both parents, Luther and Jessie May Davis; his

loving wife, Florence; one brother, and five sisters. Surviving him are Bob (Louise), Larry (Cheryl), four granddaughters, four great-grandchildren, and two great-great-granddaughters.
