Louella E Mitchell entered her eternal home June 9, 2023 at the age of 100 & 8 months. She was delivered by her grandmother Justina Bich on October 19, 1922 to Jacob J & Leontina (Winter) Bich on the family farm in Harvey, North Dakota. She was the fourth of 6 children.

She began her school years in Harvey and finished her senior year in Mandan, North Dakota. She then moved to the California Bay area, working at Camp Knight Army Base in Oakland. This is where Lou met her future husband, Richard K. Mitchell and later married in Texas. Upon his return from the WWII Pacific Theater in 1948, they invested in a Mobile Service Station in San Leandro, CA, where Lou was the bookkeeper.

In 1951, they moved to Wenatchee. They attended First Baptist Church where Lou was in the choir, on the music committee, taught Sunday school, VBS, and was a Deaconess. In the 1970's, she taught at Jean Wakes Christian preschool.

Lou is survived by her daughters, Sharon Phillips (David), of Cashmere, WA & Nancy White (Don), of Hansville, WA. Four grandchildren, Mike (Kay) Phillips, Peter (Gala) Phillips, Jenny (Gregg) Smith, all of Cashmere, and Kimberlee

(Donny) Ball, Edmonds, WA. 11 great grandchildren, & 1 great, great grandchild on it's way!
