After World War II, she moved to the Pacific Northwest with her family, where she remained for the rest of her life. Marge and her family moved to Wenatchee in 1967, where she worked as a legal secretary for the law firm of Hamilton, Lynch & Kuntz, and later as the City Clerk for the City of Wenatchee. She and Art were divorced in 1974, and, in 1975, she married Phillip D. (Darrell) Larson. Darrell was the love of her life and she was much saddened by his sudden passing last November.

As the mother of a special needs child, Marge was a passionate and lifelong advocate for the developmentally disabled and was a strong supporter of the Washington Association for Retarded Children. Her love and appreciation for the staff of the Residential Living program continued to her final day. She was truly grateful for the support they provide to her daughter, Candy Davison.

Marge also enjoyed an active role in the American Legion Post 10 Women's Auxiliary and the 8/40 organization. She valued the many friendships she made there.
