Marilyn Williams-Jursnick (75) died Wednesday, March 5, 2014 following a long battle with pulmonary fibrosis. She was born April 29, 1938 to Byrle and Evelyn Bradshaw in Glendive, MT.

After graduating from high school in Quincy, WA, Marilyn moved with her husband, Ike Williams, to Butte, MT, where she raised her family while employed by the Anaconda Minerals Co.

In 1983 Marilyn relocated to Wenatchee as one of the original employees for Asamera Minerals.

During her time in Wenatchee she married Dan Jursnick. In 1988 Marilyn was honored to be selected as the first woman inducted into the Applarians, where she and Dan enjoyed many years of travel and friendships. Marilyn also served several years as the chair of Mobile Meals.

Marilyn was a wonderful mother and caregiver and will be greatly missed. In spite of her lengthy illness, she retained her optimism and sense of humor. Her first priority was always to her family and wide circle of friends. She was a fiercely loyal cheerleader to her grandchildren.
