Mark S. Johnson, 68, passed away on March 23, 2018, at home, with his family at his side, holding his hand. He was born on April 8, 1949, to Arthur and Mabel Johnson, and grew up along the Entiat River, where he developed his incredible work ethic on the family fruit ranch, along with his three sisters. He attended Entiat schools and went on to work at Alcoa, for McDonald Construction as a carpenter, and then drove log and dump trucks.

He retired from Douglas County, where he was road crew foreman for many years, until he moved into an office as an inspector. He was never happier than when he was operating a piece of equipment.
