Nancy Rae Lynn, 73 years of age, crossed over into everlasting, eternal life the evening of September 4, 2013. She was married at a young age and spent her middle years living in the Yakima Valley, raising four children, running a daycare center and writing a column for the local newspaper. Nancy later moved to Oregon, where she met and married Jerry Lynn. They moved to the Wenatchee Valley in 1985, where she lived out the rest of her days, surrounded by family and friends. She retired from the East Wenatchee Police Department after 17 years of service. After retiring from a job she loved, Nancy continued to be involved in the community; volunteering on the Central Washington Hospital Hospice Board and serving as Civil Service Secretary Examiner for the East Wenatchee Police Department. She was very proud of being a member of the first graduating class of Eastmont High School. Nancy looked forward to getting together with her high school classmates for their monthly luncheons, where they would talk about old times as well as catch up on the new. She was an avid football and baseball fan and thoroughly enjoyed watching the Seattle Seahawks and Mariners.

Nancy was preceded in death by her parents, Tom and Jean Birmingham; and husband Jerry Lynn.
