Perry L. Greenwood, 57, passed away unexpectedly, Wednesday November 18, 2015 in East Wenatchee, WA

He was born September 7, 1958, in Park Falls, WI to Donald L. Greenwood and Janet D. (Shaw) Greenwood. He grew up in Mosinee, WI and moved to Alaska in 1982. He has lived in East Wenatchee since 2013. He worked on the North Slope oil fields of Alaska for 32 years, most currently as a Well Integrity Supervisor for AES-ASRC in Kuparuk, AK.

Perry participated in football and hockey while attending Mosinee High School. He continued his hockey career after high school, playing for Mosinee Paper Makers, coaching Mosinee youth hockey, and playing on a senior Alaska team. He also played league Softball and coached little league.

He was an avid outdoorsman. Hunting and fishing in his beloved Alaska was his passion. He loved salmon fishing on the Little Susitna and Columbia Rivers and halibut fishing in Homer. He loved attending games and tailgating. He loved all types of music and going to concerts.
