Ray L. Wainscott, 75, passed away on Monday, October 8, 2018, at his home. Ray was born in Yakima, WA, in 1943. He attended elementary school in Yakima, and graduated from Renton High School in 1961. He graduated from Washington State University in 1965. He served in the U.S. Army Airborne Special Forces division before returning to the Seattle, WA, area, where he began work with Digital Publishing and Broadcast Industries Group. He began pilot training in pursuit of his lifelong love of all things, flying, and obtained his private pilot license in 1972. He was proficient in skydiving and parachute sports, flying numerous air show demonstrations in his Pitts special biplane. He was a photographer for the Blue Angels for a number of years. He participated in water sports, winter sports, mountain climbing, and bicycling. More recently, Ray was an active member of Eastmont Worx Gym, where he was known as "Chairman of the Board" following a mild to minimum stress workout. Especially, sitting at the Roundtable leading discussions of unlimited topics along with various member interactions. Also, he flew in two radio controlled planes, and was a fixture out at the Red Apple Flier's club. Ray spent wintertime at his comfortable residence in Casa Grande, AZ, looking forward to seeing his snowbird friends there.

Ray is survived by one brother, Gary; and Ray's many friends from his various activities. He was preceded in death by his parents, Glen and Margaret Wainscott.
