Robert "Bobby" Alan Smith Jr., age 34, of Wenatchee, WA, went to be with his Heavenly Father on September 5th, 2018. Bobby was born to Robert Alan Smith and Sonja Lorree Olson on October 12, 1983 in Santa Maria, California. He moved up to Washington at the age of three and would soon settle into his beloved childhood home in Omak with his mother and siblings. Bobby talked often of his childhood and had a collection of stories about the neighborhood mischief he got into, and the great adventures he had as a boy. His younger brother, Cory, was his constant companion, and his best friend, Tievon Tachell, lived just across the street. Bobby attended Omak High School, as well as Upper Columbia Academy in Spangle, WA. In 2007, Bobby started his position as a Wastewater Operator for the City of Cashmere. He stayed dedicated to his title and planned to retire in his position. Bobby's heart unleashed a new kind of love on February 3rd, 2008 when he became a father to Olivia Smith. In 2011, he was reacquainted with a close friend of the family, Jeri Grant. They fell in love and were married on February 18th of 2012. The unity and strength of their blended family grew in the commitment to their marriage, in the love shared between all six siblings, and in the authentic faith they had in Jesus Christ.
