Clark Rolfe Ogle passed away on May 25, 2024. He was the first child born to Elmer and Wilma Ogle. He spent most of his childhood in the Wenatchee Valley, with great memories of hiking all over the hills with his long-time friend, Alan Hough. He was a tumbler in the Wenatchee Youth Circus. The circus grew and the whole family became involved.

Rolfe joined the U.S. Navy after high school and spent two years in active duty and eight years in the Reserve. He married Cora Walker in 1961. They welcomed their daughter, Carri Jean in March of 1963. Carri remembers her parents being at all of her important events.

Rolfe worked for Alcoa for 34 years, retiring in 2000. He was a welder and the Safety Committee Chairman for 28 years.

Rolfe married Pat Hussey on June 1, 1991, having run into each other during Apple Blossom the previous year. Pat has one son, Randy Roberts and they enjoyed finishing raising him up together.

Rolfe and Pat joined the Applarians in 2007 and Rolfe was honored as Chancellor in 2014.
