



## Sally Ann Schreiber

March 14, 1926 - April 21, 2016

Sally Ann Schreiber, 90, went home to be with her Lord and Savior on April 21, 2016. She was born on March 14, 1926 in Tacoma, WA, daughter of F.W."Jay" Gould and Margaret Kaynor Gould Larsen. Sally graduated from Gig Harbor High School in January 1943 and from Central Washington College in 1946, with a BA in education. Sally interrupted her teaching and coaching tennis in Puyallup, WA to join the Navy, graduating from the General Line School in Newport, RI. After serving during the Korean Conflict, she was Honorably Discharged from the Navy. Sally returned to teaching in Puyallup, later teaching in Bremerton, WA at Dewey Junior High School, Navy Yard City School, Naval Avenue School and Marion School. She was selected as Teacher of the Year while teaching 5th grade at Naval Avenue School. Sally enjoyed reading, needle point, cross stitch, swimming, sailing, bowling, and was an avid Seahawks fan. Sally married Walter Schreiber in 1955. They traveled throughout the United States with their three children. After retirement, Sally and Walt spent over 500 days at sea, mostly aboard Holland American Lines. They eventually

six continents, more than 63 countries, plus the islands and possessions of many of those countries.

Sally is preceded in death by Walt Schreiber and her brothers, Richard K. Gould and W. Keith Gould, all serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II and

the Korean Conflict. Sally is survived by daughters, Barbara Marty and Carol (Mike) Vincent; son David (Shirley) Schreiber; five grandchildren, Michael Marty, Steven (Nicole) Marty, Shannon Vincent, Kyle Knott and Kayla (Beau) Van
