“ *In Memory of Sharon Lee Hamilton Davis*

*Sharon was the second child of John Quintas Hamilton and Dorothy Fae Arnold Hamilton born Oct. 25, 1956 in Inglewood, California.*

*Sharon's older sister is Joleen (White). Younger brothers are Dean, John Jr., and Robert. The Hamilton family moved from Hawthorne area to Saugus (now called Canyon Country) California.*

*Sharon's mom Dorothy died of cancer at the age of 32 in 1965.*

*Sharon was only 8 years old, almost 9.*

*Sharon's dad married Cathy Mihm in 1967. Cathy also had 5 children; Jane (Malone), David, Sharon (Dixon), Lyle, and Laura (Sandeem).*

*It was a houseful in the Canyon Country home that was expanded to 5 bedrooms, 2 baths. All of us kids had scheduled "bath days"- and I'm told that some had to bath in used bath water! Our kitchen table for many years was a picnic table with bench seating along two walls. We were all expected to eat what was served. Dessert was called "snacks" which were often 'sold' between siblings. We had chores assigned for each week, the favorite being "table hopper"- which meant you sat in a chair (not on the bench) and you got up for water, salt or whatever was missing on the table.*

*The girls shared rooms. The boys shared rooms. Bunk beds and limited amount of toys, books, and things with so many kids!*

*Sharon had the most beautiful straight thick dark hair. She wanted it blonde at one point- it took many bleachings- I always loved her brunette color.*

*Sharon and Sharon were only one month difference in age- so they were not "Big Sharon and Little Sharon". But there was confusion with 2 Sharons!*

*All the family attended Mass at the Catholic church on Sundays. We arrived in a blue Chevy Malibu station wagon. (not enough seatbelts for every child!) We probably had our own pew as we were the largest family!*

*Our half brother, Tom Hamilton joined the family in 1969. Our family gatherings were a daily event! We always had a family dog or two. Both Sharons loved dogs. (but not Joleen!) Vacation was camping trips every summer. A few out of state trips to visit relatives in*

*Oklahoma, Arkansas or Minnesota.*

*Things were not always easy- Dad was sometimes harsh with us kids. (It was always noisy in our house) The boys and Sharon would get into wrestling fights with each other. The rule was, if someone got hurt, the other one had to take care of them before anyone came back into the house! One Christmas Sharon was in tears because there was no gift for her. It turned out her gift was missing a tag- and not passed to her. We were probably considered "poor", but we did not know that.*

*Sharon attended Sierra Vista Junior High and Canyon High School. Sharon had her first daughter Joeelyn Marie Hamilton in 1975. She was 18. Sharon married Buddy Davis who passed away from heart failure. In 1981, Sharon had another daughter Annette; followed by 3 sons, Dwayne, Andy, and Brian. The family moved from Bakersfield California to Eastern Washington. Sharon loved her family. Sharon worked hard in raising her kids. Sharon was a diligent worker for many, many years as a cashier.*

*Sharon courageously battled cancer for approximately 7 years. She was surrounded by wonderful and loving caregivers, especially Kathy and Annette.*
