



Socorro "Cora" Castillo

May 25, 1932 - July 15, 2024

Socorro Barrios Castillo (AKA: Cora), 92, of Entiat, WA, passed away peacefully on July 15, 2024.

Socorro, also commonly called 'Cora', was born in May 1932 in Nogales, Mexico. While growing up in Nogales, she spent lots of time with her four siblings, numerous cousins, and favorite Nana Virginia. She married in her twenties, moved to Los Angeles, California, and raised the first of her four children. In 1965 the family moved to Cypress, California where she finished raising her children for twenty years. She moved to Palm Desert, California for a short time until moving to Washington State for the last twenty-seven years of her life. Throughout her lifetime, Cora made many friends in each place she lived with her fun, outgoing and wonderful personality. She welcomed everyone with a hug and a smile.

Cora enjoyed cooking, crocheting, knitting, music, and of course...playing games. She was very competitive and loved playing Rummikub for quarters... and she won A LOT! Other games she enjoyed was Sequence, Yahtzee, Bunco, Uno, and coloring amazing pictures with her colored pencils. She adored cats and shared her love with many pets throughout her lifetime.

Cora was undoubtedly an incredible and loving mom, grandmother, great grandmother and great-great grandmother. She was survived by four of five children (age order): Lucy Castillo, Virginia Gillespie, Victor Castillo, Marti

Castillo, Son-in-Law – Jeff Bruer. She had ten (10) grandchildren, twelve (12) great grandchildren, and three (3) great-great grandchildren. She is also survived by one sister, Enedina Garcia and many nieces and nephews who loved her very much.

Per her wishes, her body will be cremated. There will be no formal memorial services; a small and private family gathering will take place in the fall where we will have a Rummikub tournament in her honor; playing for quarters of course!

I fondly put her favorite artists on Alexa to remember the joy the songs brought her. So many of the songs ending with two beats, “Ton-Ton” as she would say.

She was amazing as her coloring...often running out of red and green pencil colors from the flowers she favored in coloring. I would ask her what she was doing while coloring and she would smile and say, “Killing Time”...but this was her favorite thing to do. But make no mistake, she would drop her pencils down in a heartbeat to play a game of Rummikub.

Her TV favorites were Family Feud, Wheel of Fortune, Columbo, Andy Griffith, Quincy and of course...the Golden Girls. I know every episode of the Golden Girls because of her and the theme song too.

As many of you know, Mom was the nucleus of both Jeff and my life

for the last 10 years. We took on the role of her daily caregivers in 2006 and did our very best to keep her healthy, happy and safe with us. Everything we did or didn't do revolved around our loving momma. We were the lucky ones to get to experience the best of her. It was our gift to her and she repaid us with her trust, her funny sayings, her loving hugs, her singing, her laughing and her gratefulness. We have been lost without her. There are so many reminders of our lives together all around us.

I trust that I will see her again at the gates of heaven where she will be waiting. I often joked with mom and told her to remember one thing when she got to heaven...when I get to the gate she is to tell St. Peter, "Let her In!" She remembered that in the last days on earth when we laughed about that.

There are so many memories and good stories to share that are hard to pick which to share the most. So I will end with this from the Golden Girls...

Thank you for being a friend. Traveled down the road and back again. Your heart is true. You're a pal and a confidant. And if you threw a party, invited everyone you knew. You would see the biggest gift would be from me and the card attached would say, Thank you for being a friend.

her.*

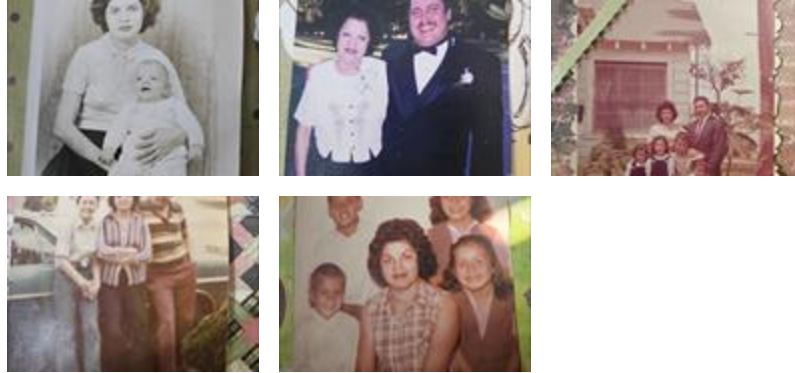

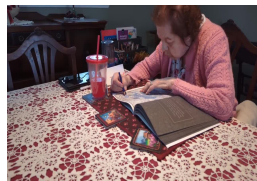

Most people who met her, even if briefly had a story about something funny she said. There is no doubt that she will be missed. If we look and listen closely we can see a little bit of her in each of us that knew her well. Cora will continue to live on through us.

Sometimes the simple things that a person does is what binds your memory of them. Here is one of those for me. Cora told me and many of you the story of how coffee was discovered. Her account of it, accurate or not is irrelevant. The important thing is that the story is hers and that it lives on. It goes something like this: Juan Valdez was out hiking in the woods one day and he was getting a bit tired so he tied his burro to a tree and started to gather some firewood. He was picking up fallen branches, twigs and shrubs. He got his campfire going and had his kettle filled with water which hung over the top of the fire getting heated by the flames. He poured himself what he thought was a cup of hot water but what it really turned out to be is the very first poured cup of coffee. The taste was delicious and this accidental discovery made Juan the famous person he is today.
