



Stanley E. Deardorff

January 10, 1928 - November 7, 2018

Stan Deardorff, 90, of Enumclaw, Washington (former Wenatchee resident) passed away November 7, 2018 in an Auburn, Washington medical facility after an extended battle with cancer.

He was born on January 10, 1928 in Wenatchee, Washington, to Noble and Ethel (Buntain) Deardorff and graduated from Wenatchee High School in 1946.

Stan married Martha Leister of LaPuente, California, on June 25, 1950, immediately moving his new bride north, to Wenatchee and Soap Lake and eventually settling in Ephrata where they raised their family. Stan went to work for the Grant County Health District in 1957 and retired in 1982. In 1987, the Deardorff's moved to Ellensburg where Stan continued his "retirement career" of lawn mowing and maintenance until his second retirement in 1993.

He was an avid deer hunter for 55 years holding to his goal to hunt until the age of 80. He and Martha enjoyed years of camping in the mountains of Washington State, and in 2000 they completed another goal of visiting all 50 states, the 50th being Hawaii on their 50th wedding anniversary.

In July 2018 the Deardorff's moved to Enumclaw, Washington, where they could be closer to family.

Stan is survived by his wife of 68 years, Martha, daughter Barbara Hansen (Ken), son Doug Deardorff (Linda), a sister Marian Gillin and a brother Wayne Deardorff. Stan was preceded in death by his daughter Janice Rosenthal in 2007 and a sister Thelma in 2015. Stan and Martha have 9 grandchildren and 19 great grandchildren.

A Memorial Service is planned for Saturday, November 17, at 11 AM at The Sunnyslope Church, 3330 School Street, Wenatchee, Washington.
