Women's Pool League, with many state titles and trophies. She was an avid reader, loved crossword puzzles, crochet and knitting and, especially, baseball. She was a BIG Mariner's fan and, in her retirement, loved to follow her grandson, Andrew, in traveling to watch his baseball games.

She was a very non-judgmental, generous, kind soul, with a great wit and sense of humor, who was dearly loved by SO many people.

She is survived by her sister, Cheryl Pierce; brothers, Marvin Jenkins and Chuck Jenkins; sister, Sande Jenkins Sandbom and husband, Rick; daughters, Denise Moses, Selena Markham, and Charla Hobbs; sons, Allen Jenkins and William Beaty; 12 grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren; and too many nieces and nephews to count.
