Walter Schreiber went home to his Savior and Lord on March 3, 2012, surrounded by his family. Walt was born to Gottfried and Elizabeth Schreiber in Portland, OR on July 15, 1921. Walter graduated from Jefferson High School in 1938. He served in the CCC in Heppner, OR. He apprenticed with the Union Pacific Railroad in 1939, and the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in 1940. In the spring of 1944, he joined the Navy and served during World War II. He was honorably discharged in June of 1946, and later reenlisted in the Navy Reserve, serving in active duty during the Korean Conflict from September 1950 to February 1952. Walter returned to the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard as a sheet metal worker, but soon transferred to the scheduling department, where he retired in August 1978, as the Head Scheduler. Walter married Sally Ann Gould on August 13, 1955, in Coeur d'Alene, ID.

Walter is survived by his wife, Sally Ann of East Wenatchee, WA; his daughters, Barbara Marty of Port Orchard, WA and Carol (Mike) Vincent of Lake Oswego, OR; his son, David (Shirley) Schreiber of East Wenatchee, WA; his brother, Vernon (Pat) Schreiber of Vancouver, WA; and his sister, Bernice Brunson of Sumpter, SC. He is also survived by his grandchildren,
