William "Bill" Maki, 91, of East Wenatchee, WA, passed away at home Saturday, April 9, 2016 surrounded by his loving family. Born August 2, 1924 at his family's ranch in Enaville, ID to Mary and Ernest Maki, Bill spent most of his youth working the family farm and later worked in Forestry and mining in Northern Idaho's "Silver Valley".
